

The Constitution of the Republic of Yugoslavia

We the people of the Republic of Yugoslavia, in order to maintain unity, protect domestic security, serve the needs of the people, establish individual liberty, and cultivate our national pride, do ordain and enact this constitution for the Republic of Yugoslavia.

Government Structure

The government of Yugoslavia will be led by the Prime Minister. The Prime Minister is elected by the people. The other government offices are appointed by the Prime Minister. Citizens may hold any number of government offices by receiving and accepting a nomination from the Prime Minister, who themselves may only hold one additional government office.

Government offices:

- I. **Prime Minister:** ensures that the constitution is carried out, oversees the well-being of the people, manages the other government officials and manages the faction.
- II. **Secretary of Defense:** responsible for maintaining the national armory and commanding armed forces in times of war (they cannot declare war without permission from the Prime Minister and a majority vote supporting the declaration).
- III. **Secretary of the Treasury:** manages national trade endeavors and funds the needs of the government.
- IV. **Secretary of Public Relations:** acts as an advisor for matters of public relations and manages propaganda. Manages the Discord server.

- V. **Secretary of Welfare:** manages national social programs, in acquiring and distributing materials to meet the needs of the people as directed by the Prime Minister.
- VI. **Secretary of the Budget:** manages and tracks national spending. Oversees the national debt.
- VII. **Secretary of the Environment:** represents Jugoslavija at the EIPO, and ensures a balance of natural conservation and development in all states.
- VIII. **Secretary of Claims:** ensures proper allotment of faction claims, and keeps the claim ledger up to date with accurate locations & descriptions.

Claims

The national government of Yugoslavia will retain two claims per citizen. These will be used to help retain a claim buffer for national security purposes. The other 18 claims for each citizen shall be managed at a state level. The Prime Minister will be responsible for supplying the 1-4 claims needed to claim the capitol building.

Voting and Citizenship

General voting occurs over a 24-hour period among the active citizens of Yugoslavia (an active citizen is defined by being active in either the faction or the discord in the past 10 days). A vote is won by the option with the majority of answers. A vote will close when a total majority is reached if 24 hours haven't passed.

An election for a new Prime Minister will be started when two or more members petition for a new election. If no candidate wins a majority of the votes, a second runoff election will be conducted between the top two candidates.

Anyone may apply for citizenship in the Republic of Yugoslavia. Upon application, a special vote will be called to accept or reject the application. If a vote receives at least two voters in approval and does not exceed one vote of disapproval after 24 hours, the vote for admittance or expulsion passes. The same manner of voting may also be called to expel a citizen from Yugoslavia.

State Government

The Republic of Yugoslavia is divided into several states, each of which has its own land and citizens. Each state is subject to & cannot override the national government. The following matters function on the state level:

- I. **Zoning:** regulations for building and infrastructure
- II. **Local claim allotment:** how claims are distributed to citizens
- III. **Trade:** regulations on imports and exports
- IV. **State law:** specific laws that do not interfere with national law

Personal Liberties

The Republic of Yugoslavia will ensure that each and every citizen has the following rights (visiting foreigners are not guaranteed any rights). States may not establish laws to infringe on any of these rights.

- I. **To bear arms:** From wooden hoes to nuclear warheads
- II. **To nourishment:** All citizens may gather food from the Kosovo Field (Kosovo Polje)
- III. **To religion:** The government shall respect the individual right to religion.

- IV. **To justice:** All citizens are guaranteed a swift and fair trial
- V. **To property:** The government shall not interfere with private property.
- VI. **To safety:** Cruel and unusual punishments shall not be used by the government (the Chicken Pit is not an unusual punishment)

Amendments

Amendments to the constitution should be introduced as a vote, but specifically require a $\frac{2}{3}$ majority of active citizens.

Protesting the Government

The people have the right to veto the Prime Minister's actions. If two or more players disapprove of a decision, they may call a vote to decide whether to block the action. This can be done as many times as necessary without needing to vote for a new Prime Minister.
