

Kunwinjku Verb Conjugations

Most Kunwinjku verbs are conjugated according to the above patterns.

E.g. for yime *say, do* we would have: yime, yimeng, yemeni, yimen, yimeninj.

Nonpast: present and future, e.g. ngamang, *I take it, I will take it*

Perfective: completed actions in the past, e.g. ngamey, *I took it*

Imperfective: ongoing actions in the past, e.g. ngamangi, *I was taking it*

Irrealis: actions not manifested, e.g. minj ngamayi, *I didn't take it; yimayi? would you take it?*

Imperative: when giving orders, e.g. yima! *take it!*
